LANG 3081 - Communication for Environmental Management and Technology III

1. Course Description

LANG 3081 is a two-credit, one semester core course for BSc in Environmental Management and Technology students under the four-year degree only. This course aims to develop students' ability to use effective and appropriate organizational structures, vocabulary, language and style in Capstone Project proposals, reports and presentations. This course is offered in the Spring only for EVMT students.

2. Prerequisite: LANG2083.

1. Knowledge and Content Related	a. Identify and recognize the format and structure of an academic report.

2. Academic Skills and Competencies	a. Develop critical thinking and analytical skills in order to produce an academic research report.

	c. Recognize the importance of audience awareness in research and report writing.	
3. Vision and Orientation to the Future	Identify a specific area in the environment that may require some intervention in the short-term with possible long-term, wide-ranging influence.

4. Course assessment

Students will be evaluated through formative and summative assessment so as to achieve the learning outcomes. The group report will be created throughout the semester and students will receive regular feedback on the content. The report will be similar in style to the FYP / Capstone for EVMT. The oral assessment is a group presentation on the report. Immediate feedback on the task performance will be provided so that students are made aware of the related communication principles.
