

## LANG 1133: Cantonese for Chinese Language Background Students I

**1. Course Information:** LANG 1133 is a credit-bearing Cantonese elective course for UST undergraduates of Chinese language background. It equips students with Cantonese communicative competence necessary for living and net-working in Hong Kong, thus facilitating their smooth integration into the local community. The learning activities involve developing students' listening and speaking skills in an attempt to build learners' confidence and fluency in using Cantonese for daily communication. Students attend three hours of class and complete up to six hours of out-of-class work per week. The course is offered in Fall and Spring semesters.

**2. Pre-requisites:** LANG 1133 is open to UST undergraduates of Chinese language background (including exchange students) and for complete beginners only. This course is restricted to students with Chinese language backgrounds but have no prior knowledge in the Cantonese dialect. No pre-requisites or co-requisites are required.
