Course Title: Basic Spanish for International Management

Course Code: LANG5330

No. of Credits: 2

Any pre-/co-requisites: LANG 1330

Course Description

LANG 5330 is a two-credit course exclusively for students enrolled in the MSc in International Management program who have previously completed LANG 1330. The course addresses all language skills (listening, reading, speaking, and writing), with a primary emphasis on interaction. Its objective is to provide students with a foundational proficiency in Spanish, enabling them to communicate effectively on a range of relevant topics and to integrate more seamlessly into academic or professional environments where knowledge of a European language other than English is assumed.

Intended Learning Outcomes (ILOs)

On successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Understand, make, and respond appropriately to everyday conversational enquiries.
- 2. Understand basic instructions, notices or information.
- 3. Take part in a basic factual conversation.
- 4. Understand short reports or descriptions.
- 5. Take and pass on simple messages.
- 6. Make factual summaries and requests based on notes taken, including times, dates and places.
- 7. Understand and give straightforward opinions and explanations.
- 8. Understand and produce short texts.
- 9. Demonstrate sufficiently accurate pronunciation and grammatical structure to be understood by native speakers of Spanish.
- 10. Show confidence when dealing with Spanish-speaking people and Spanish-language materials in their study and in business contexts.

Assessment and Grading

This course will be assessed using criterion-referencing and grades will not be assigned using a curve. Detailed rubrics for each assignment are provided on Canvas, outlining the criteria used for evaluation.

It also assesses their ability to respond appropriately to everyday conversational enquiries (ILO 1).
 Final Exam (in-class) Listening Task Vocabulary & Grammar Assessment 	ILO2, ILO4, ILO5, ILO8	Listening Task: This task evaluates students' comprehension of basic instructions and short descriptions (ILO 2, ILO 4) while also testing their ability to process and relay simple messages based on the recordings (ILO 5). Vocabulary & Grammar Assessment: This task assesses students' understanding of basic instructions or information (ILO 2) and evaluates their proficiency in recognizing and applying vocabulary and grammar rules accurately in structured, context-based scenarios (ILO 8).
