

Guidelines for Chinese Course Selection (for Chinese language background students)

1. Read the information in the table below carefully, pay extra attention to the pre-requisites (if any) of the courses, and make an initial course choice that you think best suits you.
2. Click the course code to visit the corresponding webpage. If you have any questions, please consult the [course coordinator](#).
3. Register for the chosen course on the Student Information System (SIS).
4. Take classes as scheduled. Seek the class instructor's advice if needed.
5. Complete the Chinese course selection process before the end of the add/drop period.

LANG1416C/P Effective Chinese Communication	Level 3 in HKDSE Chinese * Students admitted via JUPAS in the 2023-2024 Academic Year or later will be pre-enrolled in LANG1416P automatically in their first semester at HKUST if their level in HKDSE Chinese is lower than the pre-requisite to this course. Other students who fail to meet the pre-requisite of LANG1416C/P and cannot find another suitable course should request and get approval for a 'requisite waiver' via the SIS before enrolling in the course. These students may be required to provide additional information or attend an interview for CLE's further consideration.	Students with Level 3 in HKDSE Chinese or equivalent
LANG1416I Effective Chinese Communication	* This course is for students with special language learning needs. Consent from the class instructor is needed. * LANG1416I cannot be registered directly. Students who apply for this course must complete an online form for Chinese course selection before making a request for 'Instructor Consent' on the SIS. Applicants should take classes as scheduled. Confirmation will be made by the class instructor after the student attends the first class.	In general, students with Chinese proficiency lower than Chinese language background students but obviously higher than non-Chinese language background students. These students typically do not hold formal qualifications in the Chinese subject.
